#### **Race** location

### Weekend training, Saturday 03 March and Sunday 04 March

Snow conditions in Crevacol and Pila are perfect and the free skiing is glorious.

Free access to gate setting will be available all day and all weekend in the resort of Crevacol. # La Nouva: U16/U18/U21 Slalom Leissé: U10/U12/U14 Giant Slalom

**Prizegiving Approx 15.45** La Nouva finish area, outside the Hermitage restaurant, prizegiving for Tuesday's races and for the combined events. Drinks and cake courtesy of the sponsor.

## Prizes

The races are a challenge to schools in Britain to compete for the "Champion School Cup". Ski racers from age 8 to 20 take part, and the points system ensures that they all compete against each other by age category.

The results of the interschool competition are calculated from individual "top ten" results by awarding points within five age categories. These points are awarded separately for girls and boys: U10, U12, U14, U16 and U18/U21. The two best individual results to count each day. In the event of a tie the third best result to count (and so on). In the event of an international school winning the overall team prize a special trophy is awarded. For U14 to U21 racers the events count within the British Alpine Seeding System (BASS).

Winner, fifteen points; runner up, twelve points; 3<sup>rd</sup> nine points; 4<sup>th</sup> seven points; 5<sup>th</sup> six points; 6<sup>th</sup> five points; 7<sup>th</sup> four points; 8<sup>th</sup> three pts, 9<sup>th</sup> two points; 10<sup>th</sup> one point. (Please note that this supersedes the note on the BSA website.)

Medals will be awarded to the fastest individual six boys and six girls each day in the age categories for U10, U12, U14, U16 and U18/U21. Each category winner will also receive a 2018 Artemis British Interschool Ski Challenge trophy.

#### Gatekeepers

Please email **britskiacad@hotmail.com** if you are willing to volunteer as a gatekeeper on either day. Gatekeepers receive packed lunch and event hoodie each day by way of thanks. It's a great way to watch the race and help out.

## No Hiking

Hiking up after a mistake is illegal in Giant Slalom and only allowed in Slalom if it can be done without impeding the next racer. For U14 racers it should be noted that each separate race run is a separate BASS seeding event. The U10 and U12 racers discard their worst run each day anyway. Spread the message, please: no hiking up the hill during the races!

### BASS races for U14/U16/U18/U21

BCR competition rules. GB technical delegates: Mr Richard Ellis and Mr Richard Dawe.

BASS racers are reminded that helmets for giant slalom must conform to GBR rules (which are the same as FIS rules), i.e. no soft sides or soft vents, and must be "Class A" bearing the new FIS sticker. For U10/12 racers a hard helmet is strongly recommended. Please visit <u>http://gbski.com/helmets</u> for more information.

### Notes regarding the U10/U12 races

U10s and U12s start order will run: U10 girls, U10 boys, U12 girls, U12 boys. Each day there will be two runs on the same course with continuous course repair. The start order for the second run each day will reversed within each category. The best time each day will count for that event's race result. PLEASE hand in your bib after the second run of the slalom. We will reissue bibs for redistribution in the finish area of the giant slalom on Tuesday morning.

**Catsuits:** Racers in the U10 and U12 category will be permitted to wear catsuits depending on the decision of the team captains' meeting on Sunday and only if the weather is fine.
