This competition challenges schools in Britain* and internationally to compete for the "Artemis Champion School Cup". Juniors, Children and Minis can take part, and the points system ensures that they all compete against each other. The races are open to individual entrants and are run under British competition rules in order to qualify for British Alpine Seeding System (BASS) national seedpoints.

Race & Equipment Rules

These championships will be run under International Competition Rules (ICR) as amended by British rules (BCR) as of October 2016. It is the competitors and coaches responsibility to make sure that they are aware of these. <http://www.gbski.com/rules.php>

All racers must have full medical insurance with cover for Alpine ski racing

Equipment

Competitors and coaches are reminded that it is their responsibility to ensure that equipment, including ski length and radius, conforms to discipline specifications. Properly fitted back supports are recommended. Participants must wear approved crash helmets for all disciplines. Please note, U10/U12 may not wear catsuits.

Eligibility

U14 and over Competitors who wish to be seeded for this event must be registered with the British Alpine Seeding System (BASS) for the 2017/18 season. We will be using the current BASS seedlist. If you are not on this list you will be deemed to be unseeded - so please check.

Competitors in the U10/U12 categories must be registered with their Home Nation Governing Body or submit a signed British Snowsports Athlete Declaration Form (see above) and proof of public liability insurance, which includes cover for racing with the race entry. Proof of membership of an HNGB affiliated club will cover this.

Photographs

Photographers may be present on the hill. If you object to photographs of yourself or child to be taken please inform the Chief of Race prior to the entry closing date.

Entries

Entries should be made online at <https://www.britskiacad.org.uk/orders> school and large entries can be made directly to the BSA, and must include Athlete Declarations for non-Bass registered competitors, see above. All entries, with payment, should be received by the Championship Secretary by Saturday 17 Feb 2018. Should the race be oversubscribed then entries will be taken on a first come basis. For fees, see above. Late entries may be considered but will incur an additional late entry fee of £50 for the two-day series.

Refunds

Once a race entry has been accepted, if the races are cancelled the organisers will endeavour to refund as much of the entry fee as they can, after covering fixed costs and expenses.

Acceptance and Bulletin Acceptance

lists will be posted on Britski shortly after 20 February 2018. A race bulletin will also be emailed to entrants with a schedule for the team captains' meetings and each day's racing in good time before the event.

Artemis British Interschool Ski Challenge

The results of the Artemis Inter-School Competition are calculated from the individual results by awarding points for placings within category as follows: 1st 10 pts, 2nd 8 pts, 3rd 6 pts, 4th 4 pts, 5th 3 pts, 6th 2 pts, 7th 1 pt.

The categories for which these points are awarded, for both Girls and Boys separately, are: U10, U12, U14, U16 and one group for U16/U18.

The British Champion School will be the one with the best total points score from a maximum of two racers to count per day. In the event of a tie the organisers will consider the next best result from a third team member, and so on. Schools with only one finisher will still register in the team results table. Racers are eligible for individual prizes and may become "Schools Champion". (Where a school has divisions of "Junior" and "Main" school, entries from the two will be classed as from one school unless the organiser is otherwise informed.)

*In the event that an internationally based school finishes ahead of all the British based schools in the results table then they will be awarded an international trophy.
